

Upcoming Event: Why is Hate Crime in Greenwich under reported?

Nationally, hate crime is chronically underreported. Between 2017/18 there were 512 incidents reported across Greenwich. In 2017 the University of Huddersfield estimated that **only one in four hate crimes are reported**. There is also a concern that hate crime will increase following Brexit. This event will allow local people to identify the barriers to reporting all forms of hate crime and help us discuss solutions. The event will involve a specialist panel including;
