22 workshops for professionals in collaboration with partners, public events and awareness campaigns in community for members of the public



Staying Safe for People with Learning Disabilities

Over 50 people using services attended the official launch of Safe Places scheme, followed by workshops on safeguarding, fire safety and keeping safe in the community, doorstep crimes and scams

1,024 Referrals regarding safeguarding concerns in Greenwich



275 cases were further investigated



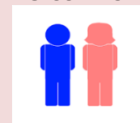
45% enquiries were about neglect



16% of enquiries were about financial abuse



13% of enquiries were about physical abuse



58% of enquiries concerned women



47% of abuse took place in the person's own home, 22% in care homes



82% of people were supported by an advocate



73% of enquiries were substantiated or partially substantiated
